

Updates From the Mayor

- Reminder to residents: No parking on Village streets from 2:00am to 7:00am until April 1st. Overnight parking is available in two municipal lots – one behind the Village Hall on Slocombe and another off West Main Street just west of the Catholic Church.
- **Snow Plowing** – as in the past, we would like to alert independent plow operators that it is illegal to plow or shovel snow or ice upon a village street, sidewalk or other public way. While most of the independent plow operators in the Village comply as much as possible with the law, there are some who need to be reminded that if a driveway is being plowed, that snow **CAN NOT** be plowed into the street, **NOR** can the snow be plowed out of a driveway, across the street and into the village right-of-way. Some drivers have claimed that they have no place to put the snow. That, however, is not an excuse to violate the Village ordinance. The Village is not responsible for snow that accumulates on a resident's property and the Village is not responsible for removing snow that has been plowed onto the Village right-of-way.
- Christmas Tree Pickup starts January 5th and will continue through the end of January. Christmas Trees may also be dropped off at the compost area behind the Village Hall at any time.
- The Village recently applied for New York Forward and Downtown Revitalization Initiative grant funding and a team comprised of Village representatives presented to the Empire State Development review board on December 16th. The presentation went very well and we eagerly await word from the State regarding the awards. Thank you to our team of representatives and to the MRB Group for their roles in the application development and submission process.
- The collection kiosks for medications and sharps, both located in the lobby of the Village Hall, continue to be a welcome addition to the Village. Individuals can take advantage of using the drop-off boxes to dispose of prescription or other drugs, as well as needles and syringes anonymously during normal business hours.
